Talk About It

1. If you had to pick just one, what is the most amazing experience of your life? Why?

Read About It: Luke 2:10-11; John 1:10-13; John 4:28-29.

Think About It

2. **Read Luke 2:10-11.** Describe how the shepherds might have felt upon receiving the angel's message? What does it mean to you today to hear the words: "A Savior has been born to you!"
3. **Read John 1:10-13.** Have you ever had to meet someone at the airport that you have never met in person before? How did you get their attention?
4. Have you ever experienced a case of mistaken identity where you thought you knew someone, but you were wrong? Has anyone ever misidentified you? How tragic was it that the world, even Israel, did not recognize Jesus?
5. **Read John 4:28-29.** Why was the woman so excited to go and tell everyone about her conversation with Jesus? What exactly did Jesus do that excited her so?

Do Something About It

6. Messiah (or Christ) means "the anointed one" and is the title of the promised, long-awaited King of Israel. What promise from God are you longing to see fulfilled in the future? How would you share that good news with others today?
